











OUR MISSION

- To provide service members and their **families** with the information necessary to make informed decisions throughout the Medical Evaluation Board (**MEB**) and Physical Evaluation Board (**PEB**) phases of the Integrated Disability Evaluation System (**IDES**) process.
- To process your case in a timely and efficient manner.




What is (IDES)? Integrated Disability Evaluation System

- This process integrates the resources of the Department Of Defense (DOD) and the department of Veteran Affairs (VA), following a set of comprehensive medical examinations (C&P) to evaluate your referred medical condition(s) as well as conditions that you may wish to claim (Service Connected).
- The process is intended to quickly deliver to service members with a finding regarding fitness for continued military service, and if determined to be unfit, to provide the service member with a single source disability rating prepared by the VA that will be used by the DOD and the VA to determine the benefits you are entitled to receive.





What is (IDES)? Integrated Disability Evaluation System Continued

- During the process, you will be counseled and advised on how you can contribute to the
 development of your case, as well as your rights and responsibilities when presented with
 findings throughout the disability evaluation process.
- One of the immediate benefits to you and your family is the convenience of <u>not</u> having to undergo redundant examinations and/or evaluations through two separate systems with the DOD and VA Contractor Quality, Timeliness, Customer Service (QTC).
- If you are determined to be found unfit for continued military service, you will experience a smoother transition, including receipt of your benefits and compensation from the VA QTC upon separation or retirement.


IDES Timeline (180 days)

Phase I	Physical Evaluation Board Liaison Officer (PEBLO) counsels member over IDES process, provides the VA Military Service Coordinator (MSC) copy of member's case file, including all Service Treatment Records (STRs)	
Phase II	MSC conducts VA Intake Interview and completes VA/DoD Claim Forms ensuring all service-connected medical conditions are properly claimed. MSC orders all referred and claimed VA C&P examinations	
Phase III	Member contacted by Quality, Timeliness, Customer Service (QTC) to schedule his/her VA Disability Benefit Questionnaires (DBQ) Appointments which will be conducted by the DVA/VBA/DoD Providers at civilian clinics within 200 miles of the members address. MSC downloads the completed C&P Exam Results and provided to the PEBLO	
Phase IV	PEBLO requests NARSUM to be written. Upon receipt of completed NARSUM member is counseled on MEB findings and given 5 Calendar days to elect with legal assistance Member Election Options: Concur - Case is sent to PEB Impartial Medical Review (IMR) – Answer NARSUM concerns	


PEBLO forwards case to the Physical Evaluation Board (PEB) for Fit/Unfit determination. Upon receipt of Unfit determination from the PEB, member is counseled on findings, Member Election Options with legal assistance: Concur election sent to transition service office, request Formal Board with or without a written appeal, or submit a one time VA reconsideration, as applicable. Fit determination - Member is returned to duty.


Appeal - Request a change to NARSUM

Member waits on his/her Final Orders, DD-214 and schedules Exit briefing with MSC on eligibility for VA benefits.



MEB Steps








Physical Evaluation Board Liaison Officer (PEBLO)

- Your assigned PEBLO will guide you through the IDES process.
- Your <u>PEBLO</u> Will Be Your Primary Point Of Contact Concerning Your Case And The IDES Process.


 He/she Will Inform You Of The Status Of Your Case.
- Please ensure that your <u>PEBLO</u> is aware of any changes to your contact information.
- Your **PEBLO** will schedule counseling sessions with you throughout the process.
- Your <u>PEBLO</u> will build your case file with your assistance in providing accurate information pertaining to your medical/administrative records.



Physical Evaluation Board Liaison Officer (PEBLO) (Continued)

Your <u>PEBLO</u> will refer you to additional resources if necessary (example: Transition Assistance Program (TAP Class), Goal, Plan, Succeed (GPS), Wounded Warrior Programs, Social Security Administration (SSA), etc. Prior to your separation or retirement.








Physical Evaluation Board Liaison Officer (PEBLO) (Continued)

Notifications to your Command/Unit:


- ARMY: Your assigned PEBLO will notify your command that you've been referred to the Medical Evaluation Board (MEB) and request administrative documentation, including the provision of a commander's performance and functional statement (DA Form 7652)
- NAVY/MARINES: Your Commanding Officer and respective service headquarters (Navy: Navy Personnel Command and Marine: MMSR4) will be notified via electronic message traffic. A Non-Medical Assessment (NMA) template will be provided to your command for completion.





Service Member's Responsibility


- The first 45 days of the process are the most critical and requests for leave may be denied during this period.
- **Do not** miss any scheduled appointments. You must be on time for all scheduled appointments.
- Any No Shows will be reported to your commander and the VA will require assurance that service members have been assigned an escort by their command and will be escorted to all future appointments before they will re-schedule any missed appointments.
- Provide all administrative and medical documentation necessary to initiate and complete the Medical/Physical evaluation board process.
- Always provide accurate contact information (phone numbers/email addresses) and maintain communication with your <u>PEBLO</u>.



Commander's Responsibility

Provide the service member's assigned **PEBLO** with:

- A completed performance Evaluation/Assessment
 - ARMY: Commander's Performance and Functional Statement (DA Form 7652)
 - NAVY/MARINE CORPS: Non-Medical Assessment (NMA)
- Provide Line Of Duty (LOD'S)
 - <u>LODD</u> Line Of Duty Determination is an administrative procedure used by the military for determining a member's **duty** status at the time of injury, illness, disability, or death.
 - <u>LODI</u> Line Of Duty Investigation is the process to determine if the Soldier's intentional misconduct or willful negligence was the proximate cause of the illness or injury.
 - LODB Line Of Duty Benefits decision has a direct bearing on whether or not a service member is eligible for VA benefits
- Ensure all personnel, and administrative documents are provided in a timely manner.
- Maintain accountability and visibility of the Soldier, Sailor, or Marine.








Review your:

- Physical Profile (DA Form 3349) Army
- Abbreviated Medical Evaluation Board Report (NAVMED 6100/5) Navy & Marine corps
- Request consults for specialty clinics, as necessary.
- Review and summarize your medical and administrative information in order to complete a Narrative Summary (NARSUM).
- Clarify any questions in the Medical Evaluation Board (MEB) regarding their findings regarding whether or not a specific medical condition meets retention standards, as outlined by existing policies.




Military Service Coordinator(MSC)



- You will be assigned a Military Service Coordinator (MSC) to guide you through the Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) portion of the Integrated Disability Evaluation System (IDES) process.
- They are responsible for assisting you with identifying all of the Service-connected Medical Conditions that you may claim during your intake interview. After this meeting, they will request for your VA Compensation and Pension (C&P) examination appointments.
- You will need to attend all scheduled VA C&P exam appointments.

The MSC is the link between you and the VA:


- They will inform you of your rights and VA actions in the IDES process.
- Gather any additional required information in order to expedite payment of VA benefits prior to separation.

VA Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VRE) – Chapter 31

- As an IDES participant, you have automatic entitlement to this program.
- VRE is an employment program but provides education/training if needed to help you get the skills needed to find entry level, suitable employment.
- You may start while you are on active duty, as long as your command approves.
- We pay tuition, fees, books, supplies, tools, equipment. We do vocational testing and provide counseling and support as you transition off active duty. Our program is nationwide.
- Once you finish training, we make sure you have a good resume and then you will work with our employment coordinator and others to help you find a job. We have paid internships and send job leads and information about job fairs, hiring fairs, etc.
- For those who cannot work at present, we can offer independent living services.

What is in a Medical Evaluation Board (MEB)?

- The Narrative Summary (NARSUM) is the HEART of the Medical Evaluation Board (MEB).
- The "NARSUM" is a comprehensive written report that is a "WORD PICTURE" of each of your medical conditions, history and status. Furthermore, it includes a determination as to whether each condition meets or fails medical retention standards as listed in the following regulations:
 - Army: AR 40-501 Chapter 3
 - Navy/Marine corps: Chapter 18, MANMED and Chapter 8, SECNAVINST 1850.4f (Navy/Marine Corps).
- If any condition fails to meet medical retention standards, your case will be referred to the Physical Evaluation Board (PEB) for adjudication.




What is in a MEB case? (Continued)

- VA compensation and pension (C&P) examination
- You will be scheduled for comprehensive C&P exams to be conducted at the VA Hospital.
- Your Medical Evaluation Board (MEB) provider will identify all medical conditions and determine whether or not they meet medical retention standards under AR 40-501 Chapter 3 (Army) or Chapter 18, MANMED and Chapter 8, SECNAVINST 1850.4f (Navy/Marine Corps).







Integrated Disability Evaluation System (IDES) Attorneys

You will be referred to a medical evaluation board counsel (MEBC) to provide legal assistance through out the IDES process. You have the right to seek legal representation of your choice if you desire, at your own expense.



- The Deputy Assistant Secretary Of Defense For Warrior Care Policy Has Requested Our Assistance In Implementing Actions That Will Improve Communication With Service Members In The IDES Process.
- These Actions Which Grew Out Of Discussions With Members Of Congress And Formed The Benefits Executive Counsel, Are As Follows:
 - Upon Initiation Of The IDES Case, The PEBLO Will Inform The Service Member And His/Her Families On A Realistic Expectation Of When His/Her IDES Case Will Be Completed, To Include The Anticipated Date Of Separation And Subsequent Receipt Of VA Benefits'.
 - Upon Initiation Of The IDES Case, The PEBLO Will Instruct The Service Member To Create
 An Account At www.Ebenefits.Va.Gov And www.Myhealth.Va.Gov/Mhv-portal-web/Home.
 - Army Service Members Can Track The Progress Of Their IDES Case Through The IDES
 Dashboard In Army Knowledge Online (AKO).
 - Navy And Marine Corps Service Members
 Do Not Have The Capability To Track Their IDES Case Through A Navy Or Marine Knowledge Online Portal.


