TGSLI: 1) Provides tax free up to \$100,000 per traumatic event, 2) The benefit is paid directly to the soldier or his/her beneficiaries, 3) Serves as short term relief to meet immediate need, not as an income replacement, 4) Has minimal affect on military or VA benefit determinations. 34	EDUCATION COUNSELING & GUIDANCE	VA Chapter 35 Education Benefits: Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance Program	Lee Miller WWMP Point of Contact Reggie Washburn DVA	Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance add Public Law 109-461, VA is a program managed by the Department of Veterans Affairs that provides up to 45 months of educational benefits to children and spouses of disabled veterans and surviving family members of deceased veterans. The recipients can use the benefit for many different educational experiences and the VA may approve even non-traditional courses under certain circumstances. To be eligible for the Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance Program you must be the spouse, child, stepchild or adopted child of a veteran (living or deceased) who was rated as permanently and totally disabled. Children and spouses of service members who are missing in action or are captured and being held by a hostile force are eligible for DEA. The spouse can apply and, when accepted, begin 45 months of college at \$1,137.00 per month. The program covers part time attendance, on line, or face-to-face on campus classes. It also covers those who have a degree and want graduate school or other advanced education. TO APPLY: Contact Lee Miller who will assist in applying. Once the application is complete, the package goes to Mr. Reggie Washburne at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) office at WRNMMC Bethesda, Building 11, Room 165. Mr Washburne will review the application, attach the medical records and forward the application to the VA. A copy of the birth certificate of the spouse and a copy of the marriage license is required to accompany the application. This process is a VA special exemption for seriously injured WW's. The EBV is designed to open the door to business ownership for veterans by 1) developing skills in the many steps and activities associated with launching and growing a small business, and by 2) leveraging programs and services for veterans and people with disabilities. The veteran must have an idea/opportunity identified upon which to develop a business plan during the nine day "Bootcamp" (11 hours a day) at one of the major business schools participating in the EBV Program. After application and two letters of recommendation, the veteran completes some on-line modules on entrepreneurship prior to going to the nine day "Bootcamp" at one of the six major university business schools around the country. The veteran is then put on orders from their WTU. All travel, meals, and lodging is paid for by the EVB Program while the veteran prepares a business plan. Upon completion of the "Bootcamp." The veteran receives one year of free legal advice and the assistance of an entrepreneurship Professor from the business school attended. If spouses are involved in the chosen business, they can also attend the EBV Program but not at the same time as the veteran. Any veteran interested in the EVB Program should contact Lee Miller who will assist in the application process and refer the veterans to the previous graduates of the EBV Program for guidance and information. The schools involved in the EBV Program are Syracuse University, Purdue University, UCLA, Texas A&M, Louisiana State University, Florida State University, and UCONN.
